Fedora is an operating system based on the Linux kernel, developed by the community-supported Fedora Project and sponsored by Red Hat.

What is Fedora?



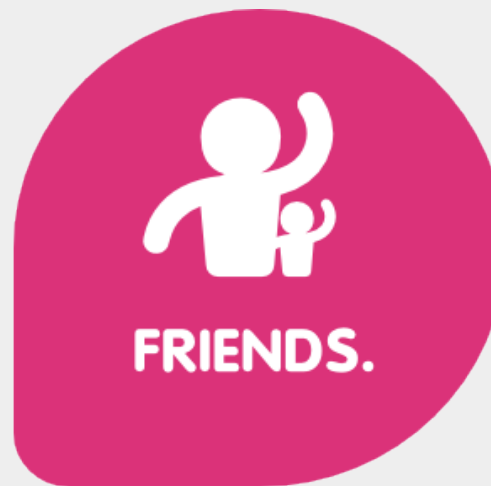
- GNU/Linux Distribution.

- **Never cutting corners.**

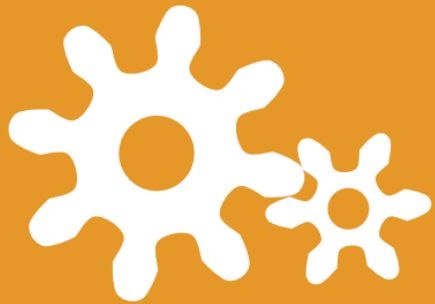

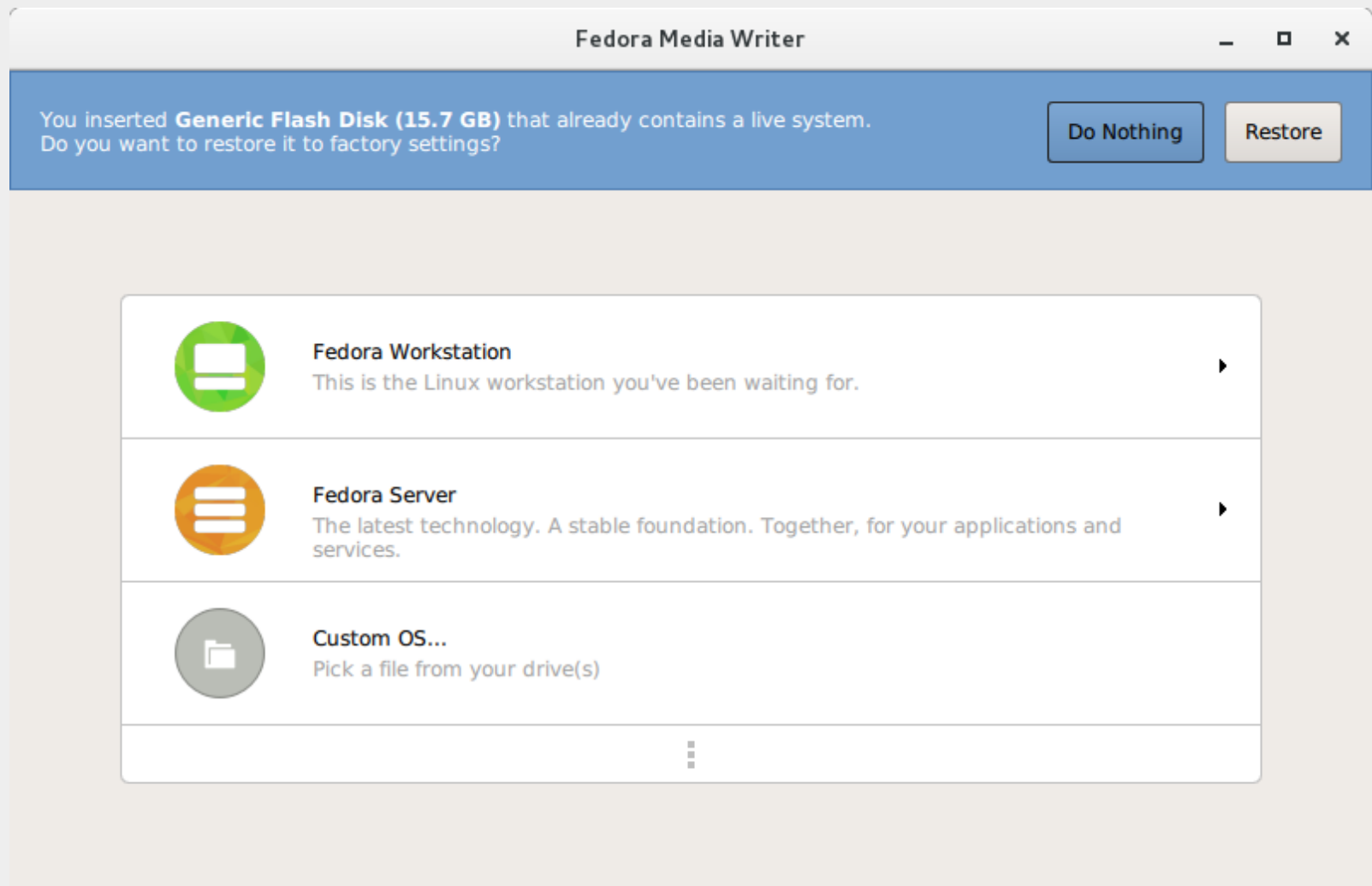
